

LANIGAN MINE TOUR – Friday, May 25, 2007

Potash Corp of Saskatchewan

The mine is located near Guernsey, approximately 1.5 hours east of Saskatoon. We are expected to be on site and through security at 8:10am for an 8:30 tour. The tour is expected to last approximately 4 hours. The bus will depart from “Potash Corp Place”, outside the Commerce Building of the University of Saskatchewan, 6:30 a.m.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION REGARDING THE MINE SITE VISIT

This is an underground tour of an active mine. Please be aware that you will be exposed to a close environment, dust particles, heat, and industrial noise. Read the following safety and information items in preparation for the mine visit.

ATTIRE: shorts, skirts, or dresses are NOT PERMITTED. Jeans or similar are REQUIRED

SHOES: sensible walking shoes are required. Sandals or high heels are NOT PERMITTED. You will be walking on uneven ground in the mine.

CONTACT LENSES: some people have trouble with contact lenses due to the salt dust in the atmosphere. Please do not wear contact lenses if at all possible.

HEALTH: this is a rigorous tour with considerable walking and climbing stairs. It is not recommended that those with breathing problems such as asthma, heart problems, severe arthritis, or those who suffer from claustrophobia participate

DUST: you will be exposed to salt dust.

HEAT: the mine is warm at 27⁰ C; product is discharged from the dryers at 200⁰ C. DO NOT touch product and equipment.

NOISE: you can expect high noise levels of a typical industrial setting.

GRATING: some people are uncomfortable walking on floor grating when they can see through to the main floor below.

PERSONAL PROTECTION: visitors are REQUIRED to wear a HARD HAT and SAFETY GLASSES while on site (provided at mine site).

OTHER: DO NOT carry cellular phones or personal radio/CD devices.

CAMERAS: You may bring your digital camera. The decision as to whether they are permitted on the tour is at the discretion of the mine tour leader.
