**‘Doors Open Saskatoon’ returns -
Third Year for this Great City-wide Adventure
June 3, 2007**

On Sunday, June 3, 2007 approximately 30 of Saskatoon’s most interesting buildings will open their doors to all comers. In 2006 “Doors Open Saskatoon” attracted over 16,000 visitors. This year thousands more are expected to celebrate our built heritage by turning out to see these unique spaces - many of which are not normally open to the public. This third annual event is a collaboration of the Saskatoon Heritage Society, the City of Saskatoon, the Municipal Heritage Advisory Committee and Meewasin.

“Saskatoon’s wholehearted response to our previous two celebrations convinced the organizing committee to forge ahead again in 2007.” said Kevin Kitchen, chairman of the Doors Open Organizing Committee. *“Once again we will be able to step inside our city’s architectural gems, modern landmarks, boardrooms, classrooms, museums, theatres, churches, pioneers houses, civic departments and government offices. Many of these buildings are not normally open to the public. No tickets or pre-registration will be required – admission is absolutely free.”*

The Doors Open concept is a simple one: buildings of architectural, historical or cultural significance open their doors to visitors for a day. Many provide guided tours, special exhibits, displays or performances. In all cases, it is absolutely free. This Saskatoon urban adventure joins the tradition that began in Europe and has spread all over the world. New York City, Sydney, Australia, and Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, recently launched their own Doors Open programs.
