Applications are invited for a tenure-track faculty position in Small Animal Surgery at the level of Assistant/Associate Professor in the Department of Small Animal Clinical Sciences starting July 1, 2011 or when a suitable candidate can be found.

The primary responsibilities of the successful candidate include: Quality instruction in small animal surgery to undergraduate and postgraduate veterinary students; participation in clinical teaching; participation in the soft tissue and orthopedic surgery clinical service of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital; and contributions to continuing education. Scholarship and clinical research in small animal surgery will be encouraged and expected. Extensive opportunities for collaborative research exist within the College and the University (College of Medicine, College of Pharmacy and Nutrition, College of Dentistry, College of Engineering, and College of Kinesiology) and the Saskatoon Cancer Centre. The University of Saskatchewan (www.usask.ca) has the widest array of health science colleges in the country and is also home to the Canadian Light Source, Canada's national synchrotron light facility (www.cls.usask.ca). Applicants must possess a D.V.M. degree or its equivalent and must be eligible for licensure to practice veterinary medicine in Saskatchewan. Candidates with postgraduate qualifications will be given preference. ACVS board certification or completion of an ACVS approved residency is a requirement.
