### Chair in Aboriginal Education

The College of Education invites applications for a joint, tenure track appointment at the Assistant Professor level across the Departments of Educational Administration and Educational Foundations to commence July 1, 2011.

The successful candidate will hold a Chair in Aboriginal Education (subject to budgetary approval) for the first five years of the appointment (renewable) and will provide academic leadership in the Indian Teacher Education Program (ITEP), as well as participating fully in the graduate and undergraduate teaching, research, community outreach activities and collegial processes expected of faculty members. The strong outreach focus of the Department of Educational Administration, and the reputation of the Department of Educational Foundations in Indigenous Knowledge and in social and ecological justice, will provide an ideal academic home for the successful candidate. The College of Education is committed to excellence in Aboriginal education, outreach and research and also houses the Aboriginal Education Research Centre (AERC). The successful candidate would join the current team to advance the work of the AERC.

The ITEP program is well known and respected across Canada and for over thirty years has prepared outstanding Aboriginal teachers in the Province of Saskatchewan. The successful candidate will join a dynamic ITEP team working with both the on-campus and community based delivery of the growing ITEP elementary and secondary programs.

Candidates should have a doctoral degree or be near completion. Successful teaching experience in K-12 schools and demonstrated success in working with Aboriginal communities is a requirement. A strong track record of working to advance the rights of Aboriginal peoples and honour Aboriginal cultures would be a definite asset.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadians and permanent residents and those with Aboriginal status will be given priority.
