

## **Veterinary Medical Imaging**

Applications are invited for a tenure-track faculty position in Veterinary Medical Imaging at a rank and salary to be determined depending on experience and qualifications. The position is available on July 1, 2011, or when a suitable candidate has been found.

The primary responsibilities of the successful candidate include: Quality instruction in medical imaging to undergraduate and postgraduate veterinary students; participation in the clinical teaching and service programs of the Veterinary Teaching Hospital; and contributions to continuing education. Scholarship and clinical research in medical imaging will be encouraged and expected. Extensive opportunities for collaborative research exist within the College and with the University (College of Medicine, College of Pharmacy and Nutrition, College of Dentistry). The Western College of Veterinary Medicine is developing a veterinary cancer center for which the medical imaging specialist will be an integral part. The position requires knowledge and expertise in small and large animal medical imaging with knowledge and expertise in one or more of the following: MRI, nuclear medicine, ultrasound, and computed tomography. The University of Saskatchewan ([www.usask.ca](http://www.usask.ca)) has the widest array of health science colleges in the country and is also home to the Canadian Light Source, Canada's national synchrotron light facility ([www.cls.usask.ca](http://www.cls.usask.ca)).

Applicants must possess a D.V.M. degree or its equivalent and must be eligible for licensure to practice veterinary medicine in Saskatchewan. Candidates must have diplomate status or board eligibility in ACVR or ECVDI at the time the appointment becomes effective.
