Regina, SK (Regina General Hospital)

The Department of Academic Family Medicine, University of Saskatchewan requires a certified Family Physician to fill a locum opportunity in our **Regina Unit** located in the Regina General Hospital. This contract locum opportunity involves a balance of patient care and teaching of undergraduate medical students and family medicine residents. This locum opportunity of up to 8 months duration and up to 9 half days per week may commence on or after November 1, 2009.

We are particularly interested in hearing from family physicians who are interested in sharing their expertise, experience and/or interest in Family Medicine through teaching and providing patient care in a clinical environment.

Our Department consists of six divisions, including Saskatoon Urban (West Winds Primary Health Centre), Regina Urban (Regina General Hospital), Research, Rural (Victoria Hospital in Prince Albert), Emergency Medicine (Royal University Hospital) and Northern Medical Services. Physicians and residents in all locations participate in the provision of a broad range of patient care, including adult medicine, obstetrics, pediatrics and in-hospital/nursing home care.

Certification, or eligibility for certification, with the College of Family Physicians of Canada is required. The successful locum must be licensed, or eligible for licensure, to practice medicine in the Province of Saskatchewan and eligible for hospital privileges in the Regina Qu'Appelle Health Region.
