

**POUNDMAKER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP  
Guidelines to Applicants**

This Scholarship has been established through the generosity of Mrs. Eileen Bell of White Rock, BC. Mrs. Bell was, for many years, a school teacher in Saskatchewan.

The Scholarship is available to all students who are registered Indians born in Saskatchewan. Students must have completed two years of a direct entry teacher education program or now be in his/her third or fourth year of a four year program at the University of Saskatchewan, the University of Regina or the First Nations University of Canada.

At present the Scholarship is administered by a committee composed of a representative from the Native Law Centre; the University of Saskatchewan College of Education; and the University of Regina Faculty of Education.

The Committee will consider the following factors in awarding the Scholarship: academic achievement; and leadership ability including contributions and aspirations to the Indian community.

Applicants should attempt to provide the information requested below in as much detail as possible. Applications should be forwarded to: Scholarship Committee, Native Law Centre, University of Saskatchewan, 160 Law Building, 15 Campus Drive, Saskatoon, SK S7N 5A6 by **July 31**.

1. Name (in full) and Social Insurance Number.
  2. Current Address.
  3. Indicate the Faculty or Educational Institution in which you are presently enrolled.
  4. List all classes that you are taking at the institution in which you are presently enrolled.
  5. List all other post-secondary institutions that you have attended.
  6. List all post-secondary courses you have taken at those institutions and your success and performances in those courses.
  7. Give a personal statement of your contributions and educational aspirations to the Indian community.
  8. Are you a status Indian? - Please submit a copy of your status or treaty card.
  9. Of what Band are you a member?
  10. List all Indian and Native organizations in which you are involved.
  11. Give details of your involvement in the organizations you have listed above.
  12. List two referees who are familiar with the community work which you have performed.
  13. Bearing in mind the criteria on which the Scholarship is to be awarded, list any other information which you feel may be relevant to the committee.
  14. Candidates should ask the educational institutions they are presently attending to supply transcripts of academic performance along with assessments on student teaching. The assessments on student teaching will include those made by the supervising teacher in the classroom and also a faculty member of the institution you have attended.
