CANADA RESEARCH CHAIR (TIER 1) Environmental Health

The University of Saskatchewan invites applications from outstanding scholars with a strong research profile for a **Canada Research Chair (CRC)** position in Environmental Health.

Founded in 2007, the School of Public Health is an interdisciplinary initiative of the University of Saskatchewan, that provides innovative opportunities for graduate training, public health research, programming, and community outreach. Working closely with various research centres and leading national and international scientists, industry experts and practitioners within the University of Saskatchewan, the School of Public Health offers academic and research excellence in a number of areas, such as: agricultural and rural health, Aboriginal peoples' health, the socio-behavioral aspects of public health, vaccinology and immunotherapeutics, veterinary public health, and global health. The school also works closely with community-based organizations, health regions, First Nations groups, and the Ministry of Health and the Public Health Agency of Canada to provide advanced population and public health services. Currently, the school offers a course-based Master of Public Health program, and thesis-based master and doctoral degrees in biostatistics, and vaccinology and immunotherapeutics. Over the next five years these programs will be supplemented by new graduate degrees in epidemiology, socio-behavioral health, and health administration/leadership. The school is currently seeking accreditation by the Canadian Association of Schools and Programs of Public Health, Association of Schools of Public Health in the European Region and the Council on Education for Public Health.

The ideal candidate will have a PhD or equivalent qualification, be a nationally or internationally recognized scholar with a strong record of scientific publications, a long history of successfully attracting competitive research funding and have experience or interest in developing interdisciplinary research partnerships and approaches. Applications are welcome from strong candidates in Environmental Health. The successful candidate will be appointed to a tenured or tenure-track position at the associate or full professor level. The chair will be awarded for a seven-year period and is renewable. Review of applications will begin immediately and will continue until a suitable candidate is found.
