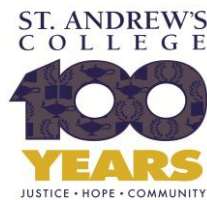
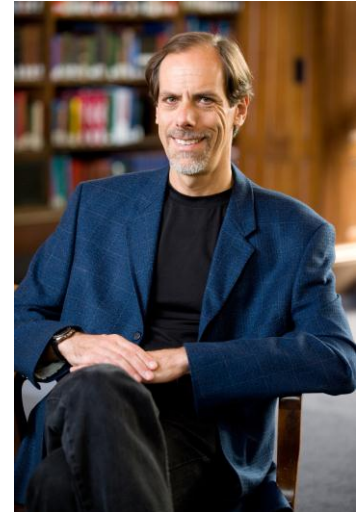
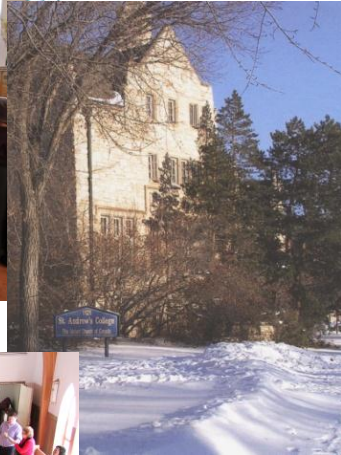

David M. Carr is Professor of Old Testament at Union Theological Seminary in New York City. He is the author of a number of books, including *The Erotic Word: Sexuality and the Bible* (2003) and *Writing on the Tablet of the Heart: Origins of Scripture and Literature* (2005). His interests include the formation and shape of the Bible, sexuality and gender in the Bible, and using trauma theory to read the Bible. He has lectured in the U.S., Britain, Germany and Norway and works often with churches, synagogues and other groups.
