

PART-TIME RESEARCH TECHNICIAN POSITION AVAILABLE

Toxicology Centre University of Saskatchewan

- POSITION:** A part-time research technician position is available immediately in the Aquatic Toxicology Research Facility with **Dr. Jason Raine**. The position will run from approximately **April 15 to November 1, 2013**, although there is a possibility that the duration of the position will be extended.
- QUALIFICATIONS:** Candidates should have completed an undergraduate degree in biology, toxicology, environmental science, or another appropriate natural/environmental science program. Candidates that have completed a related college-level technologist program will also be considered. Previous laboratory or animal husbandry experience would be beneficial. The desired candidate must be dependable, organized, responsible, enthusiastic and able to work independently.
- RESPONSIBILITIES:** The successful candidate will be required to handle a wide range of tasks involved in the day-to-day operation of the aquatic facility. Duties will include providing assistance to researchers using the aquatic facility, regular equipment maintenance, monitoring inventory of equipment and supplies, setting up tanks and related equipment, fish husbandry, water quality testing and other general laboratory duties as required. There may also be the opportunity to be involved in research projects and learn additional laboratory skills. Appropriate training will be provided.
- SALARY:** Commensurate with education and work experience.
- DEADLINE:** Applications will be accepted until **April 12, 2013** or until a suitable candidate is found. Applications will be reviewed as they arrive, and there is a possibility that an applicant will be hired before the application deadline.
- TO APPLY:** Applications must include: 1) a detailed resume or curriculum vitae; 2) a list of three work-related references who may be contacted to provide an evaluation of the candidate; 3) a cover letter outlining specific qualifications and interest in the position; and 4) a copy of up-to-date academic transcripts (unofficial copies are acceptable).
