

Summary

Quacquarelli Symonds (QS), a company that specializes in providing study abroad services, released the 2022¹ QS World University Rankings on June 8, 2021. In total, 1,673 institutions were considered globally and 1300 were ranked², including 28 Canadian universities and 145 new universities. The University of Saskatchewan (USask) was ranked at 458 in the world, climbing by 7 positions from the prior year (465). Considering there were approximately 26,000 universities globally, USask was positioned amongst the top 1.8% universities in the world.

Domestically, similar to recent years, USask ranked 16 among Canadian universities. The top ranking Canadian universities were University of Toronto (26), McGill University (tied for 27), University of British Columbia (46), Universite de Montreal (111), and University of Alberta (126).

What is the Ranking Based On?

The QS World University Rankings is based on the weighted scores of six indicators listed in the table below:

¹ The QS rankings are named to reflect the intended readers: students who plan to attend university in the following year.

² The top 500 universities were ranked individually from 1st to 500th place. Universities that were ranked between 501st to 600th were placed in groups of ten (e.g. 501-510, 511-520, 521-530, and so on). The remaining universities were ranked into categories: 601-650, 651-700, 701-750, 751-800, 801-1000, 1001-1200, and 1200+.

Rank by Indicator

Globally, USask ranked highest in International Faculty (237) and International Students (278), and lowest in the Faculty per Student measure (558). USask slightly improved in three of the six indicators this year, increasing by 2 positions in the International Students indicator and minor improvements in the two reputational indicators (by score only – only 500 schools ranked). Overall, these small changes resulted in the slight positive change in the overall ranking.

Compared to our U15 peers, USask ranked highest in Faculty per Student (9) and Citations per Faculty (11). We ranked lowest in Academic Reputation (15) and Employer Reputation (15), where we remain significantly below U15 median values.

¹ The QS rankings uses z-scores to normalize the results. That is, indicator scores are calculated based on the distance between each value from the mean average of the entire dataset. Theoretically, a USask score of 11.8 in Academic Reputation means that 11.8% of the universities who participated in the QS rankings are ranked below the USask; or in other words, 88.2% of the universities scored higher.
