

Summary

The *Globe and Mail* released its [2012 Canadian University Report](#) (opens pdf) on Oct. 25, 2011, presenting letter grades (A+ to D) of 60 Canadian universities on a number of categories of university life. Grades are based primarily on the responses of more than 43,000 undergraduate students across Canada on a student survey. The results represent the opinions of those students who completed the survey for the institution they are attending, which included 1,196 students from the University of Saskatchewan.

Comparator Group

The U of S was included in a group of 14 medium-sized universities with enrolments of 10,000-22,000. Other universities in this group are: Brock, Dalhousie, Guelph, Memorial, Mount Royal, Queen's, Regina, Sherbrooke, Simon Fraser, U of T Mississauga, Victoria, Wilfrid Laurier and Windsor.
